Listening Around the Bands

For the past few months, now that the novice class licence is available in the States, Station WLAW has been transmitting very slow speed code on 3555 KC., for those interested.

80 Meters

There have been a few short openings to Fanama, Nicaragua and Brazil. I notice South American commercial stations with CW traffic swiping some frequencies. To some operators, the Q.R.M. may be bad. However, the possibilities of working the southern states are open all the time. If you check those calling on some net frequencies, the Florida and Oklahoma sigs are quite readable.

40 Meters

Increasing activity in all the states is noticeable. The ten meter phone gang have to go somewhere. The DX has been short time and irregular on all the bands, but the occasional (ZS) South Africa and (VR2) Fiji area stations come in, also some (KH6) Hawaiian passing msgs. to states.

20 Meters

The mobile phone seems quite popular, W9 in Florida, W5 and WØ in Carolina's area put good sigs up here. The DX skip has been in a N.W. to S.E. direction. I hear VE8's and a few (JA) Japan, also (ZE) Rhodesia (ZD) Nigeria (OQ) Congo coming in, all at CW frequencies.

10 Meters

Very short DX openings to (CX) Uraguay and (OA) Peru, have produced some good signals. I miss the Maritime mobiles who were active some time ago. I heard /MM in Gulf of Mexico, off the California coast, and others in the Atlantic on the way to European ports almost every day. Perhaps since the Korea trouble there has been restrictions put on. Frequent short skip during October with Ohio and VE2 stations heard indicated MUF for 50 mc.

6 Meters

It is interesting to hear local activity by our own club members. The noise level in my location is not much good on this band for hearing W's or other VE's at any distance from town.
