Amateur Radio Station VE3CCG Peter Burnett - Op.

1948, came back on the air as VE3CCG, with a Hallicrafter's SX28 receiver and 40 watts on 20 & 40 M. C.W. Graduated to 75 M. phone in 1951 and 2 meters in 1952. Apart from the SX28 receiver, everything else is home-made. VE3CCG gets as much kick of making Ham gear as working it when its finished.

Novel R.F. Indicator

Recently while visiting a local electrical contractor's hop, I noticed a large number of discarded neon tubes of various sizes and shapes which had been taken from broken or out-dated neon signs.

Upon asking what value these neon tubes had, he answered, "absolutely none", and when I suggested I might put them to some use, he gave me three. One of these tubes, triangular in shape, is loosely coupled to my open wire feeder (the tank coil would do just as well). It is an invaluable aid in tuning up, the more R.F. in the feeders, the further along the tube the neon will glow. Modulation causes the brilliance to increase and decrease. A glance tells you whether you are on the air. Most of these tubes have a brilliant red glow, and make a startling impression on the visitor to the shack. Best of all, they're free.

CONSTITUTION OF THE QUINTE AMATEUR RADIO CLUB

ARTICLE I

(a) Aims

We, the undersigned, being desirous to promote the art of Amateur Radio and advance the spirit of goodfellowship among members, do enact this Constitution as our governing law.

ARTICLE II

(a) Membership

All persons interested in Amateur Radio shall be eligible for membership upon payment of the Club dues.

ARTICLE III

(a) Officers

The officers shall be, President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer. Officers shall be elected for a term of one year. No officer to serve more than one consecutive term in the same office. His term to be from January to December. Vacancies to be filled by a ballot. Officers to be elected by a simple majority. Officers may be removed by a motion sustained by a ballot of 3/4 the voting members.

ARTICLE IV

(a) Duties of Officers

The President shall preside at all meetings and conduct same according to this Constitution. He shall decide all questions of order. Sign all documents adopted by the Club.

The Vice-President shall assume the duties of the President in his absence.

Generally assist the President in his duties.

The Secretary shall keep a record of all meetings. Keep a roll of members. Submit applications for membership. Carry on all correspondence. At the end of his term, turn over all Club property to his successor.

The Treasurer shall receive and pay all monies. Keep an account of all transactions. Submit a monthly report and a yearly complete report on the financial standing of the Club. At the end of his term, he shall turn over all Club property to his successor.

ARTICLE V

Meetings

Meeting shall be held once per month. The time and place to be designated by the President. No meetings will be held in June, July, or August. At a meeting, one-third of the members shall constitute a quorum. Special meetings may be called by the President. Notices of all meetings must be in the mail at least 48 hours before a meeting.

ARTICLE VI

Dues

The Dues are payable in December of each year, and the sum is to be fixed by a simple majority vote of the members present at any regular meeting. Non payment of dues or any Club assessment may be cause for expulsion from the Club in the discretion of the members by a simple majority vote of those present at any regular meeting.

ARTICLE VII

Amendments

This Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of total membership. Proposals for amendments shall be submitted in writing at any regular meeting, but may not be voted on until the next regular meeting.

ARTICLE VIII

Rules

"Roberts Rules of Order" shall govern all proceedings.

ARTICLE IX

Constitution

The Constitution shall be in the possession of the Secretary and he shall bring same to all meetings of the Club.

ARTICLE X

Committees

All Committee Chairmen shall be appointed by the President and shall report to the President.
