

*CAR RALLY - FEBRUARY 8th & 9th: We have been asked to provide communications at some of the check points north of Belleville.

There will be 300 Canadian and Foreign entries in this rally. We will be talking about this event to some length at the January meeting.

- *NEW RAG-CHEW CHANNEL FOR 2 METERS? It has been suggested that one additional rag-chew channel should be used to supplement 52 52. In other words, a local channel in addition to the international channel. This has been brought about by the necessity of getting off 94 94 so as not to clobber repeaters. VE3RL suggests 146.55 ... it's a nice and easy one to remember and it also is one of the assigned simplex channels available. Any comments?
- *Mike, VE3AGT, has put up a dipole for each band. This is in addition to a trap dipole and a 2 meter beam he's got a real antenna farm out there on Herchimer Ave.
- *20 meters is open at night now and a lot of DX can be heard on 80 late in the evening ... has anybody got anything to report about 80M DX?
- *Since the repeater output frequency change, George, VE3DLB, in Colborne is unable to work through VE3KBR he hits Toronto at the same time off the back of his beam. He expects to get some rocks for 52 so that he can work the rag chew channel we should hear him soon.

 When a contact is made, switch to 52. Avoid
 using 94 as a working channel you may
 interfere with the operation of two repeaters:

Doug Pepper, VE30Z, managed to scrounge one for us and brought it down on Saturday, Dec. 15th. With the able assistance of Barry, VE3CJC, our local repeat-er helper, it was installed with excellent results. The receive range has been greatly increased and we can now up the Tx power by 100%.

*Our local parts dealer, Zentronics, has been purchased by NEDCO, the distributing and sales branch of the Northern Electric Company.


*Henry, VE3GON, has an FTDX-100.

*LICHTNING DAMAGE: It does not require a direct hit from a bolt of lightning to cause damage to your rig. Two recent mishaps occuring to SSB transceivers were created by a NEARBY strike which affected the antenna circuits in both rigs, destroying a rectifier in the SWR bridge and simultaneously destroying the BFO transiste in one. Symptoms resulting from non-grounded systems that have been in thunderstorm areas may include one or several of the following: garbled SSB reception, loss of control of rf gain and limiter adjustments, loss of meter functions in the SWR and power positions.

Although thunderstorms are seasonal, now is a good time to get at all those things you promised would be done last summer. To protect your system and yourself install a lightning arrestor as shown on the previous page or purchase one. RADIO SHACK makes one available for \$5.50 (Catalog #21-1049).


*ARE WE APPROACHING THE TIME OF THE QUIET SUN?

Whether or not the sunspot count has a very practical effect on the weather, it definitely affects the ionosphere. Once every 11 years, solar activity and sunspots drop to an absolute minimum. Although the next low is not due until about 1976, the ionosphere is already doing strange things to international radio reception.

Between Dec. 1, 1972 and Jan. 31, 1973, the Korean Central Broadcast station at Pyongyang was audible in eastern Canada on 2850 KHz between 1630 and 1730 EST on at least 40% of these dates. Both the frequency and time are very unusual; in the past, medium-wave reception from the Far East was virtually unheard of at that time of day.

Does this mean that the effects of the sunspot low will be especially noticeable this time around? If so, as the count drops lower, some days this winter we should be able to hear Pyongyang's Tx on 2850 or Radio Korea at Seoul on 2510 KHz.

- *ELECTRONIC WATCHES: It has been predicted that 4.78 million solid-state digital watches will be sold by 1980. I wonder if VE3RL is setting up a watch repair division shortly???
- *ELECTRONIC CALCULATORS: The "mini" calculator market will follow its upward thrust in 1974. Thanks to MOS chips and high production, prices will be driven lower than ever look for \$39.95 six-digit calculators and 8-digit, four function "teaching machine" calculators at under \$30 by next fall!!
- *DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME: A reminder that Ontario will be adopting Daylight Saving Time on Jan. 6 ... this move is not to save energy, but to follow the Americans and avoid confusion in TV programing, airline schedules, etc.
