The New Repeater frequencies have been well publicised by now but I still get requests to print them in the Bulletin. So here goes once more. Crystal frequencies for your rig are: TX 146.400 RX147.000 of course the repeater itself receives on 146.400 & transmits on 147.000.

Speaking of Grystals, we have run into a sneaky trick some of the suppliers are pulling these days. Never, we repeat never, order a crystal and tell him you want it for a HW202 or a IC22 etc. without specifying the complete crystal info as found in your manual for the rig. His idea of a suitable crystal for amateur use is a general purpose crystal. He will only supply a commercial grade when he is asked to do so. Otherwise you get general purpose. (no good for the Kenwood, Ultracom, Icom or Yaser rigs) and most of the time won't work well in the Barn Door rigs either.

All Canadian Amateurs should study Docket 20282 (Proposal for changes) to the U.S. Amateur Licensing picture. It's too long to produce here but has been covered in QST, CARF and RSO Bulletins fully.
