On Tuesday 21 Sept. the new solid state receiver & control was installed at the Repeater Site. Eric VE3GSI and Glen VE3CJG helped to make it a relatively quick job. It was all in & working in about 3 hours. About 75 lbs. of equipment was removed and a small 3 lb. box took it's Place. Evident changes are as follows:-

1. A delay of 2 seconds on drop-off (was 1 sec.).

2. Time out is now 5 Min. (was about 3).

3. Reset is now accomplished by the received carrier & not from drop-off of the repeater. This means that you do not have to wait for the tail as you did before.

4. Sensitivity is about 5 db better.

5. Audio quality is greatly improved with less deviation & we can now accommodate narrow band rigs much better.
6. The identifier now completes its cycle before dropoff.

The Sunday Nite 2 meter net will resume operation on 3 Oct. at 7 PM and every Sunday thereafter. Tim VESHCM will be net control as usual.


