


Al Davis VE3HNJ has provided this service for the club for the past few

The Pioneer ARC have proposed a Portable Repeater for club activities and as an emergency backup for the two Pioneer Repeaters. It will have three channel capability:

VESTEL 146,430 - 147,030 VESKBR 146,985 - 146,385

VE3TEL 146.430 - 147.030 VE3KBR 146.985 - 146.385 147.990 - 147.390 (Reserved pair for experimental and portable repeater. A Simple Inexpensive 2 meter antenna
John VE3BZT sends along dope on an antenna- that costs less than \$5.00
and can usually be made from junk box parts. As he points out this
antenna has been around for about 30 years and you will find it in handbooks and antenna books of most years. John has built a number of them
using a bamboo fishing pole or a piece of 2X2 lumber for support. No 12
wire can be used or almost any stiff wire you might happen to have around.
It's fed with 75 ohm coax and a simple coax balun. Don't forget to cut
the balun to its electrical length - that is multiply the length of the
balun loop by the factor for the coax being used (i.e. .8 for foam cable
and .66 for poly) which, of course, makes it shorter than ½ wavelength.
