Gary has made the station a major interest since it began operating, and I have learned that the hospital has established an award to recognize the long and dedicated volunteer service that people render to it. Gary VE3HWS, with well over 2000 hours of service over 7 years, is on the plaque in the entrance lobby of the hospital, along with the other people honoured. It should be noted that an important service that Gary and VE3SMH perform is to pass traffic on behalf of people who are in the hospital. This service has proved to be a great morale booster, and helps speed the recovery of the patients.
