- 10) A page of data about the autopatch now in service for Belleville is included. Please note that this whole effort is the cont= ribution of Glen Campbell VE3CJG. He has assembled and tested all this equipment and is operating it on his own home phone for your use and all at his own expense. May I, on behalf of all of us in the club and in our area, extend to Glen our sincere thanks and appreciation for this worthwhile job. I would like to emphasize here that the autopatch can be a

very valuable tool if one is in or sees an accident happen while mobile. The means to call police or other assistance is at hand. One word of caution here; remember to remain calm and to be clear when speaking to a Central Dispatch.

Call Operator and ask for ZE 50,000 for 0.P.P. and ZE 90,000 for an ambulance. Clearly identify yourself, the situation and the location. Do not hang up until you have permission from Dispatch to do so. Carry an area road map in your auto so you can identify the streets and roads to Dispatch. Carry the above emergency numbers in your auto along with others as you see fit. One last word; Dispatchers find it difficult to deal with hysterical or incoherent callers, so please remain calm and patient if you are questioned by them.

Attempted abuse of the autopatch privilege will result in its removal. It will not accept toll charge numbers. Offensive language is not acceptable and may be cut off at any instant by pushing the # button.

VESBEL AUTOPATCH

An Autopatch has been set up at my QTH on a frequency of 146.43/147.03. The system uses the following equipment:

VHF Engineering Receiver (Club property)
Identifier (Club property)
12 VDC Power supply (Club property)
Set of Cavities (Club property)
Ultracom 25 Transceiver (used as a transmitter)
HXF Electronics Ham Patch
A Ringo Ranger Antenna at approximately 50 feet.

The equipment receives on 146.430 Mhz and transmits on 147.030 Mhz with a VE3BEL identifier. It is hoped that the usable range for a mobile would be from 10 - 15 miles.

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Select 146.43/147.03 and listen to make sure the frequency is clear. You could also listen on the input frequency (146.43) if your equipment is capable. Transmit your call letters. (VE3ABC for the patch)
- 2. Key your PMT and transmit the code 592. This keys the transmitter, connects the telephone line and activates various timers.
- 3. Dial the seven digit telephone number.
- 4. When the call is finished transmit the # sign. This will disconnect the telephone line and cause the transmitter to identify.

PLEASE NOTE THAT THIS NOT A REPEATER and cannot be used as one.

NOTES

Many timers are incorporated in the Hampatch. The access code (592) must be sent within 5 seconds.

An activity timer will turn the patch off if a signal is not received every 45 seconds.

Keep your calls short. A duration timer will turn the patch off after 4 minutes. A warning tone will be heard 1 minute before time out.

If instead of dial tone a short beep is heard, this indicates that you are accessing the patch but the telephone is in use. Try againguals later.
