The funeral was well attended by many amateur radio people from all over eastern Ontario.

for emergencies. 7.0 mhz - Trans. Prov. Net (TPN) 7.055 USB 10:00 a.m. -4:00 p.m. daily.

28 mhz - Various beacons show band openings.

144 mhz - 144.100 low end calling frequency.

144.52 simplex, emergency frequency.
This one is for satellites. Please keep clear of it.
on its published frequencies offers a lot of useful information daily: 1.818, 3.58, 7.08,
14.07, 21.08, 28.08, 50.08, 147.555 mhz.

UWV is also very useful for several items of propogation besides the time standard, 2.5, 5, 10, 15, 20 mhz. should be included also: 3.330, 7.335, 14.670 mhz.


