WIAW

ARRL operates a Headquarters station using W1AW, the original call of its founding father, Hiram Percy Maxim; thus, it is often known as the Maxim Memorial Station. Many services are performed for the operating amateur over W1AW every day, including bulletins of information and latest news, code practice at speeds from 5 through 35 wpm, and certificate-qualifying runs, etc. The complete W1AW operating schedule appears in QST, and is also available on request from Headquarters with an s.a.s.e. Ask
