When activating the link, please ensure that the connecting hubs are free of traffic before continuing. The TBF 220 hub is now a channel to PBO and MUS (NFM). Also, it is important to identify your station prior to EACH link step.

From TBF, dial the hub (241 on, 240 off), and then PBO (281 on, 280 off).

If you dial up a repeater and find it busy, it is good manners to break in, identify yourself, and then dial it off. Do not simply touchtone it off in the middle of a conversation.

SHACK REPAIRS: During the summer, several members repaired the old shed. It needed to be jacked up, re-supported, insulated, etc. Thanks to LLE, DUI, NYC, DFD, and ALF for their effort. Also, Mark (BDJ) was up the tower sometime this summer working on the 220 antenna.
