IPARN is coming to Ontario. Many Ontario Amateurs have recently received information on IPARN - The Inter-Provincial Amateur Radio network. IPARN is building a Canada-wide, full-time satellite network which will be interfaced to local repeater networks in every province and territory.

You will simply use your handheld and your local repeater to talk from one province to another...coast to coast! This is a chance for many newly licensed Amateurs to work 'DX' on 2 metres! The network is already operating in B.C. and Alberta and has been for over a year and a half with regular nets and many new friendships made. IPARN recently announced a target date of 1 June 1992 for expanding the satellite network into Ontario through TFMCS and VE3ULR Repeater Association networks.

The key to reaching this target date is membership support. If you have not yet received any information on IPARN please let them know by writing to: IPARN P.O. Box 3156, Langley, B.C. V3A 4R5. If you have already received some information, take another look at it and seriously consider joining IPARN today. This is your opportunity to have a say in the future of Amateur Radio networking in Canada.

At the next meeting of The Quinte Amateur Radio Club I will move or cause to be moved the following motion. Submitted by Tim Pekkonen VE3HCM January 15, 1992.

MOTION TO AMEND
the Constitution
of The Quinte Amateur Radio Club

To amend ARTICLE 3 as follows:

ARTICLE 3

OFFICERS

a)The officers shall be President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer. Officers shall be elected for the term of one year. Term of office shall be from July 1st. to June 30th. Vacancies to be filled by ballot. Officers to be elected by a simple majority. Officers may be removed by a motion sustained by a quorum of 3/4 of the members present.

The Past President shall also be considered an officer of the club.

EXECUTIVE

b) The Executive of the Club shall consist of five officers, that is President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Past President. The Officers of the Club shall be Full Members.

The reasons for amending Article 3 are as follows:

1) To recognize the contribution of the Past President makes to help the newly elected Executive at the beginning of it's term.

2) To enable the Club to more easily fulfil the requirements for a quorum at Regular monthly meetings. According to Article 5, three executive officers are required in addition to 15% of the Membership.

REG VARCOE AWARD

1. This award was instituted by Mr Reg Varcoe, VE3RR, to encourage Amateurs to take part in emergency work, experimenting, or any other activity that will add to the prestige and pleasure of the Amateur Radio fraternity.

2. The trophy is awarded annually covering the period ending June 30. It is to be awarded to the club member or associate member (including officers and directors) who, in the opinion of the membership, has made the greatest contribution to Amateur Radio in general or to the Quinte Amateur Radio Club.

3. The trophy may be for outstanding work in any of the following:

- emergency service;
- assistance to members in obtaining their license;
- pioneering work on unused frequencies or new techniques;
- traffic handling;
- or any other outstanding Amateur Radio activity or service to the community.

4. The award shall be a plaque to which a tab shall be added each year showing the name of the winner, his callsign and the year. The winner may keep the plaque for one year.

In addition to the plaque, there will be a subscription for one year to an Amateur publication as selected by the Executive. This subscription will be paid for by the Reg Varcoe Fund, as per Quinte Amateur Radio Club Constitution Article 12.

5. Nominations will be submitted in writing to the Executive, stating the reasons for nomination, and signed by two members or associate members, including officers and directors, of the Club. The winner shall be decided by a ballot of the members present at any regular meeting.

6. Rules may be amended by the Executive at the beginning of the contest year.

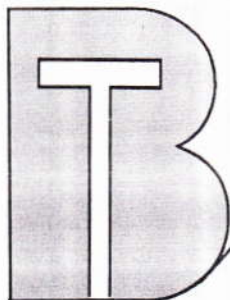

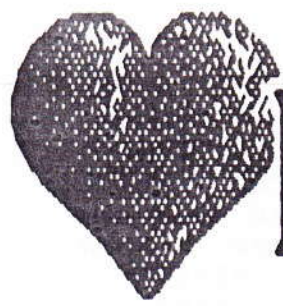
