I recently received my Quarter Century Wireless Association journal and I came across a couple of names of Silent Keys, that only us old timers that are long in the tooth will remember. They will remember Hallicrafter receivers and transmitters that were built during the years of WWII.

The Hallicrafter company was founded by Bill Halligan, W9AC, who became a silent key July 14th at Miami Beach Fl. Some will remember Mechanics Illustrated and Electronics Illustrated two magazines published by Robert (Bob) Hertzberg, 2ABK, W2DJJ, and K4JBI, he became a silent key June 30, 1992, at the age of 87.

You will note his first call sign 2ABK, this was before the international per-fixes were used, and the French word DE (from) used between call signs of the called and calling stations. The Nationality of a station was determined by the letters used in place of DE, and referred to as an intermediate. My source of information for this bit of trivia is an old 1928 ARRL Handbook, (a priceless relic to me.) I found it when I was clearing out some junk, at one of the first places I worked. It illustrates U.S.A. calling procedure as: CQ CQ CQ nu 8ASV 8ASV 8SVS.

Canada used nc as intermediate. Great Britain used eg, and it also contains a list of the intermediates used by the countries of the world at that time. An International Convention was held in Geneva in 1927. This was when the country prefixes we familiar with came into being. It took the countries a while to ratify the agreement and I guess that is why they were still shown in 1928. The use of DE the French word for from is a result of that convention. By the early 30s de was used.

My information on the conventions was obtained from "Radio Amateur Licensing Handbook" by Jim Kitchin VE7KN. Jim Kitchin had been a D.O.C. Radio Inspector, his book was purely Canadian and contained a list of Canadian Amateur Call signs it was published in 1976, an earlier edition was published in 1959 but without the list of Canadian call signs.

Will be presented to: Amateur radio stations, or SWL's anywhere in the world who complete the following contacts:

ONTARIO [VE3] stations must make 2 way logged contact (or SWL heard) with 50 different ONTARIO [VE3] amateur radio stations, 10 of which are along that portion of ONTARIO'S HERITAGE HIGHWAY (old #2) from Toronto to the Quebec border.

If the Heritage  $\sharp 2$  is in a city or town, the postal address is confirmation that the station is a HERITAGE HIGHWAY contact. (Metro Toronto, R. R.  $\sharp 6$  Cobourg, etc.)

The rest of North America (Canadian provinces and U.S. states) require 30 VE3 contacts with 6 along the HERITAGE HIGHWAY.

Outside North America (DX) require 15 VE3 contacts with 3 along the HERITAGE HIGHWAY.

QSL'S ARE NOT REQUIRED.....ANY BAND.....ANY MODE...

A copy of logged contacts including: time, frequency, call sign, name, and location, together with an alphabetical check list with an asterisk(\*) denoting HERITAGE HIGHWAY contacts, to be mailed or delivered to the club address as shown below. Successful applications will receive THE HERITAGE AWARD of ONTARIO CANADA by mail or at a club meeting and their names will be published in the Club Bulletin.
