A Familiar New Repeater Call in Kingston

The following article appeared in the November edition of the *Kingston Amateur News*:

"Users of the 146.34/94 Kingston repeater will have noticed that identifier sends **VE3KBR** in code instead of **VE3KER KINGSTON**. On 22 October 1996 the repeater licensee Tom Lloyd **VE3UDO** went to the IC office in Belleville and arranged for the callsign **VE3KBR** to be transferred from the now discontinued Roblin repeater to Kingston.

The **VE3KBR** callsign was held by Doug Hinton **VE3BGY** of Belleville who kindly relinquished it. The 443.3 MHz repeater and packet systems at the John Orr tower will remain as **VE3KER**. The KARC 2-metre repeater is now **VE3KBR** and it will be located at McAdoo's Lane shortly.

The former 146.385/985 repeater frequencies of **VE3KBR** are now in use in Belleville as **VE3QAR**."

Kingston Simulated Emergency Exercise

On Sunday November 3, an exercise was held in Kingston with the following scenario: 30 cm of snow has fallen and blizzard conditions exist with a further 30 cm of snow expected. A terrorist group has toppled some Hydro towers and as a result, Hydro power is out. At 9:30 AM the local ARES Net swung into action with several stations actually running on backup power supplies. For the next 2 hours several messages were passed back and forth between several locations. This was a good simulation of the real thing with a couple of planned and unplanned situations cropping up: An "over eager" W4 station breaking in on the main frequency offering to take traffic and inter-mod interference. VE3IVC and VE3UO travelled to Kingston to observe the exercise, as well as representatives from Brockville, Perth and Lanark county. The entire exercise was planned by **Bob Boyd VE3SV** and he did an excellent job of it.

There will be a de-briefing meeting at the next Kingston ARES meeting and hopefully it will be attended by VE3IVC and VE3UO with a report of this meeting to be made at the next QARC meeting.

JNOS and PACKET: TIME for CHANGE:

VE3APF

All packet users are presently going direct to each other or via someone else (digipeating) on VHF (145.610). The (Trenton: VE3YTR) local area node and the wide area node (Blvl: VE3BEL) both operate on the same frequency. As you might imagine, peak periods of activity and the wide coverage area of each LAN can lead to HTS (Hidden Transmitter Syndrome). HTS is caused when a user in Madoc and a user in Picton or Napanee, or wherever, are competing for channel occupancy at one of the nodes. Since neither user can hear the other on direct, and since the frequency is simplex, the node station only accepts the strongest signal of the two, or none if both user packets collide.

The solutions are usually to restrict coverage to local areas only, thus the acronym LAN (Local Area Network). Each LAN should be on a different frequency. They would, however, need to be linked to the Network or Backbone system on a HTS free (dedicated) frequency. This becomes costly to each, meaning more radios, tnc's and antennas. With present activity what it is, there has been little difficulty with HTS, but only because the users have been co-operating by setting their persistence and other parameters to meaningful values.

Another way to solve the HTS problem is to use a packet repeater. Thus all who can hear the node, also hear the other users' packets. While there is still a possibility for packet collisions arriving at the repeater, the HTS problem is virtually eliminated. Perth area users have a UHF 9600 baud packet repeater with a wide area footprint which is becoming increasingly popular. (cont'd next page)

JNOS and PACKET: TIME for CHANGE:

I am proposing to use the 444.450 (+) 5 MHZ. (my old voice repeater) on packet and to have it tied to the ve3bel Node stack for the same purpose. Voice activity was next to none, so why not make use of the UHF repeater (modified for data! Access will be 1200 baud to start. As a matter of fact, The UHF data repeater went into use Oct 7th, and its first user (besides myself) was ve3bel-10 a new tnc and radio at the node stack.

Note: ve3bel-10 was the eeprom I had on hand, and I hope to eventually replace it with a new 27C512 eeprom (donations accepted) with type X1-J programming. The X1-j firmware will allow TCP/IP routing and Telneting functions.

I have a 10 watt repeater on now at the house testing various TX delay settings and through-put on packet. Now, since there is a UHF packet repeater (VE3MHZ) and UHF port at the VE3BEL node, Trenton could choose say 145.010 for VHF and with a simple two-port diode matrix and 2nd TNC and UHF radio, and quietly backbone their way to the Network.

NETROM and JNOS

I have a pet peeve about Jnos and Net/Rom. My theory is if you only have one port you are NOT a node! Sorry if this offends some users. Jnos has a lot of "smarts" and one of them is its "NETROM" capabilities. The problem occurs when a user with only one port (usually on 145.610) invokes netrom and begins appearing as a "NETROM NODE" on the local LAN. The Network sends this new NODE in its' broadcasts to other NODES and pretty soon, IPNERD:VE3???, the (meaningless) node which goes nowhere, appears on every node list along the network. The unfortunate part is when a user who thinks this new station is part of the network, connects and finds out this is someones personal JNOS station. If you use JNOS please try to avoid using Netrom. If you use NETROM, use the HASH (#) symbol ahead of your Netrom and AX25 aliases (e.g. #IPAPF) so you will only get rebroadcasted as a hidden node.

Send me your packet questions. If I don't have the answers, I'll try to find out so we can all learn.
