QARC Meeting Minutes

The meeting started promptly at 7:30 Pm with the Guest Speaker Bill Milligan VA3WOW giving a presentation on Amateur Radio and Computers. There are several operating modes one can operate on using your computer, i.e.

AMTOR/FSK/RTTY/SSTV/APRS, just to name a few.

One can also use make use of a Packet Cluster. Al VE3FZ gave a summary of the local cluster Node in Picton VA3PEC-5 operating on 145.07 Mhz. Packet Radio is making a bit of a comeback especially with ARES applications such as 'Airmail'. Also TELPAC is used to send email to internet email addresses.

If one has a computer, you can make use of the internet for propagation conditions, ham callsign servers, weather and time. Also a lot of clubs and organisations have websites, such as RAC, ARES Ontario, TAPR, and of course local ham clubs. Ham Radio equipment and accessory manufacturers also have websites.

There is also software available for downloading, such as contest logging software, CW training programs, and antenna modeling and design.

There are websites for news about ham radio such as 'This Week in Amateur Radio', www.twiar.org, where you can download news into a MP3 player as well as listen to on line.

At this point Bill turned the meeting over to Peter Hodgson VE3UR who gave a demonstration of some of the programs he uses on his computer.

Peter mentioned the ADMS software programs used to manage the frequencies loaded into his YAESU radios, and that he can use the same channel numbers in each radio. Also he has developed standard frequencies for use in ARES radios at several locations. He also demonstrated Satellite tracking (Satscape), APRS (UI-VIEW), and also mentioned Echolink, but not having an Internet connection available, could not demonstrate it.

Peter also demonstrated GPS Trackmaker, which is a program you can download the track of your GPS and plot it.

Mike VE3OX presented Bill VA3WOW a QARC tee shirt as thanks for developing a power point program of his presentation.

As always, thanks go out to Dave VE3UGT for looking after the refreshments for our break and rag-chew.
