I was asked to write a "couple of paragraphs" in tribute to our friend Paul Davidson, VE3UUM. Paul became a Silent Key on May 29th in his 41st year. Writing a "couple of paragraphs" would be a challenge equivalent to taking all of the equipment in a 1977 Heathkit Catalogue and placing it all into a single large chip, can't be done!

I first met Paul five years ago when I moved to Campbellford and was searching for a local ham radio club. I quickly learned that his lack of physical mobility was more than matched by his incredible intellect. He was a remarkable font of knowledge on all matters "ham radio", as well as a World War II historian and an aviation enthusiast.

We spent many hours chatting about all these subjects, and never seemed to exhaust Paul's depth of knowledge. As the "glue" that held the Tri-County ARC together Paul was unfailing in his energy and enthusiasm for club events, but more importantly, his never ending support of Public Service events.

Dog Sled races, Hilly 100 rides, Cribbage rides, Marathons, Trent River Clean up Dive, Santa Claus parades and local fairs all received the benefit of his communications skills. ARES support was another of Paul's great interests.

As a "P.C. Wizard", Paul was always there to provide an answer for the latest computer crash. He blended his love of amateur radio and software with exploration of HF and VHF packet and digital modes. WinLink, Packet, APRS, IRLP and other methods of communication were of great interest to him. He recently switched to an electric wheel chair and his latest project was to assemble equipment to add to his new mobility tool. This new station was to be the first APRS Wheelchair icon in the territory.

If you wanted to hear "what do you think about that?" start discussing politics with Paul and take up a different view of a topic...there was very little he didn't know about the workings of Government at all levels. Similarly, start a discussion on Windows and be prepared for a Linux sales pitch.

He was unfailingly polite, a true gentleman and never complained about his lack of mobility. If you ever met his devoted parents, Joe and Rose, you will know how he acquired those qualities.

Paul will be greatly missed by all his friends in the amateur radio world. His beacon will be forever bright from his new altitude....

From Dave VE3BIP: Now that the longer daylight is here, the Rossmore Radio Club (RCC) is planning a series of foxhunts over the summer months. The suggestion is to hold a monthly foxhunt on the 4th Thursday of each month through the summer; May 24, June 28, July 26 and August 23.

RULES: Everyone is welcome. If you have never hunted before come to the start location and ride along with one of the more experienced hunters. There is some spare equipment available so ask one of the regular hunters if you may borrow some equipment to try foxhunting. First transmission will be at 7:00 PM and the hunt should be over within 90 minutes or less. The fox can be anywhere with the following guidelines. Must be heard from the start point. Must be in a public location; i.e. no private property. Must be in a safe location; e.g. not in a high traffic area. Hunters start at the former Ben Bleecker arena at the corner of Sidney and Bridge St in Belleville. If there are participants from the County we can switch the start point to Bloomfield for some of the hunts. Shortest driving distance wins. Dave will be the fox on May 24th unless someone else wants to volunteer. After the hunt we can meet at the Village Pump in Rossmore (the clubhouse for the RRC) to do a post hunt analysis, pick a fox for the next month, and discuss other important events of the day.

ARISS MILESTONE: 300TH CONTACT

(from ARRL Letter, June 8, 2007)

On Thursday, May 31, Amateur Radio on the International Space Station (ARISS) made its 300th contact since its inception back in December 2000. This milestone QSO was to the NASA Teacher Conference in Houston, Texas. The first contact was on December 21, 2000 to Burbank School in Burbank, Illinois.

The United States leads in the number of ARISS contacts with 153. Japan is next with 25; Australia has 18, Canada has 16, Belgium has 10, the United Kingdom and Germany have 8 and France has 7 contacts. A total of 28 countries have made contact with the ISS through ARISS.

For schools interested in setting up an ARISS contact, first check with your local school! See if the school's Amateur Radio school station is sufficiently equipped to enable a successful contact (i.e., general technical level, transceiver + power, steerable antenna, tracking programs and such). Please take into account the expected level of deployment of the Amateur Radio equipment operated onboard ISS. Next, carefully fill out the application form (this can be found at http://www.rac.ca/ariss/arissapp.htm. Please make sure to include the school's educational proposal. The educational proposal should include answers to these questions: How will you: a) integrate this activity into the school curriculum and b) involve as many grade levels as you can, participating through essay contests, poster drawing, letter writing and so on?
