Eric Pierce, VA3EP will talk about how to install and operate an HF/VHF/UHF mobile station, using his Yaesu FT-857 with ATAS-120 in his Honda CRV as an example. The presentation will cover how to safely and effectively install and operate a HF/VHF/UHF mobile station, and will cover: why operate mobile, types of rigs, installation, DC power, Antenna System and final safety checklist. Eric holds a Basic, Advanced and Morse ticket. He has a degree in electrical engineering from Ryerson University, and over 30 years experience in theelectronics and computer industry.

#### Break:

- A break for coffee, cookies and a rag-chew took place with our Guest Speaker Eric Meth – VE3EI to follow. Thanks to Dave – VE3UGT for the goodies.

Tim – VE3UO introduce our guest speaker Eric Meth – VE3EI.

Eric's presentation is about ICOM's new "D" Star Digital Repeater System.

Eric is a field agent for ICOM and has lived in Montreal, Toronto, Calgary, Fredericton and places in between. He now resides in Niagara-on-the-Lake. His main interest is in APRS, PACKET and DIGITAL modes of ham radio.

He worked for Motorola for 25 years, 25 years ago. He also worked for Kenwood for 10 years. He operates a Marine Electronic Store in St. Catherine, ON.

His presentation consisted of a Power-Point Slide Show and a promotional movie about ICOM.

Eric – VE3EI mentioned some interesting info as follows:

- "D" Star is an open-source protocol software developed by JARL the Japan Amateur Radio League.
- Designed for amateur radio use only.
- Kenwood and Yaesu also have digital systems for commercial use only; for applications such as: cell phones, Police and Fire.
- The major benefit and advantage that of "D" Star provides is SPECTRUM EFFICIENCY.
- "D" Star use only one-third of the bandwidth of analogue systems, or it will accommodate three (3) times the number of frequencies in the same spectrum space.
- London Ontario just went to "D" Star a week ago.
- "D" Star is almost world wide and growing.
- Google the map of the world and it will show every installation located in NA/Europe/SA and Australia.
- Interesting enough Japan has a different system!!
- In Canada the nearest repeater to Belleville is VE3RTR, in Cobourg.
- There is also one in Uxbridge VE3RPT.
- Another one is just outside of Lockport, NY.
- There are lots in Quebec and USA.

Eric demonstrated the crystal-clear clarity of Digital sound with "D" Star compared to the noisy "hiss" produced by FM analogue systems.

- The number of systems is growing daily:

In 2007 there were 700 systems worldwide – In 2008 there are over 5000 systems.

Eric mentioned some interesting facts about ICOM:

- They employ about 1000 employees and 800 of them are Hams.
- ICOM's Land Mobile systems consist of 60% of their total business
- Amateur Radio represents only 10% of their business.
- All radios are built in Japan.

It was a very interesting presentation.

There were 31 in attendance.
There was no 50-50 drew.

## 'Tour of the County' Foxhunt - Saturday October 18 2008

Everyone is welcome. If you have never hunted before come to the start location and ride along with one of the more experienced hunters. There is some spare equipment available so ask one of the regular hunters if you may borrow some equipment to try foxhunting.

Hunt starts at Pinecrest School in Bloomfield. First transmission will be at 12 noon, and the hunt will last up to 3 hours. Check in on PERC repeater 146.730 – before the hunt if you need directions.

The foxes can be anywhere in Prince Edward County. One fox must be heard from the start point. The other foxes must either be heard from the start or from the 1<sup>st</sup> fox location. Must be in a public location; i.e. no private property. Must be in a safe location; e.g. not in a high traffic area.

\*\* Shortest driving distance wins. Time is not a factor in your score to prevent it from becoming a road race.\*\*

After the hunt we will meet at the Bloomfield town hall to do a post hunt analysis.

### **RAC** e-mail address
