Reg Varcoe Award to be retired

This award was instituted in 1961 by Reg Varcoe VE3RR (SK) as anAmateur of the Year Award, or to use the exact wording "Man of the Year', award. It has not been presented since 1998. so at this month's meeting there will be a discussion to officially retire this award. There were two other awards the club created and handed out, but they were retired in 1991. A brief history of these three awards was given at last month's meeting, and a motion will be presented at this month's meeting to retire the Reg Varcoe award.

Fun with World War 2 Radios

On Monday night October 15 during NRN activities Steve VE7SL on Mayne Island BC called Don VE3LYX with the PARASET (WW2 spy station in a box) Don was operating his WW2 No 19 tank radio . Freq was 7121kcs . The exchange took a couple if tries but was completed. The PARASET is a crystal controlled one tube transmitter of 5 to 7 watts and has a two tube regenerative receiver.

The No 19 tank radio is a full transceiver and has typically 10 to 15 watts output. The exchange of that distance (2261 mi ATCF) between these two WW2 rigs is unusual. Greeting afterwards were received from members of the RSGB of the No 19 group as well as from NL (Henk, the Paraset guy)

Never in my wildest dreams did I dare imagine a PARASET to No 19 QSO let alone at that distance. Conditions were rough with a substantial noise floor. That each of these sets has a sort of peculiar voice helps in tough conditions. Contact was with CW at about 10WPM.


