One of your Editor's fond memories was during his college days at Loyalist setting up a regular CW Sked with Dick from the college ham station VE3ALC and VE3SSC, a station that Dick had set up and operated at Campbellford Secondary School to promote ham radio to the students. The VE3SSC call stood for 'Secondary School Campbellford'.
