Advanced License Course

As mentioned in previous communications, we are planning to try and run two courses a year if we get enough students, one in the Feb/Mar/Apr timeframe, and one in Oct/Nov timeframe.

There has been some verbal interest in an Advanced course for Oct/Nov, so <u>now</u> is the time to email me to register and make sure we have enough students! If you know someone who is not in the clubs that might be interested, please forward this information.

Please note the following:

The course will run every Tuesday and Thursday evening from **Tuesday Oct 8** to **Thursday Nov 21**. That means that we are not "standing down" for the 2 PERC meetings. This means that students and instructors might miss the PERC meeting, but after extensive discussion with past students, instructors and others, we feel that the stand down interrupts the cadence of the course, and makes it longer.

Likewise, we will not be standing down for Halloween, that means this might conflict for people planning in Halloween patrols. Same logic as above.

Tim VE3UO has kindly booked the classroom in the Children's Safety Village in Belleville, and we have lined up a projector so the format will be lecture with presentation, visual aids and demo. We would love to have fully equipped electronic labs and do a lot of hands on, but we just don't have the resources.

The instructors have not been confirmed yet, I will be contacting the "usual suspects", but if there is anyone who has their advanced that would like to try out a session or two, that would be more than welcome (you can have some of mine if you want : -) If you don't have any classroom time, I or another instructor would be more than happy to "elmer" you on that.

Cobourg Waterfront Festival - Fern Blodgett Sunde

The town of Cobourg is planning to put up a statue in October 2020 commemorating Fern Blodgett Sunde who grew up in Cobourg and was the first female wireless radio operator during World War II. The Cobourg Heritage Committee had a booth set up for fundraising and raising public awareness at the Cobourg waterfront festival on Canada Day weekend.

The committee reached out to QARC and the Peterborough Amateur Radio club for volunteers interested in manning their booth for 2 to 3 hour shifts with Heritage committee staff interested in displaying antique vintage radios and/or a morse code display with simple keys and oscillators. Don Dulmage VE3LYX and Tim Pekkonen VE3UO answered the call and worked one shift on Saturday complete with Don's WW II receiver and a display of morse code oscillators and keys. (Thanks to Peter Hodgson VE3UR who loaned some keys and oscillators.) The 'dits and dahs' attracted the ears of the Radio Amateurs of Canada Southern Ontario Director, Phil McBride VA3QR, who just happened to be attending the Waterfront Festival with his family. Phil stopped in for an 'eyeball' QSO with Don & Tim.
