

QARC Zoom Meeting Minutes - December 16, 2020

The meeting invitation was sent out saying the meeting would start at 7:30pm but President Dave VE3UGT waited a while to make sure everyone coming was in attendance, then began the meeting by welcoming everyone with thanks for attending.

He then informed us of <u>Silent Key</u> **Glen Campbell VE3CJG**. Glen and **Sandra VE3HON** are long time members of QARC. Glen was treasurer of the club for 2 terms in mid 70's. Sandra served as secretary for one of those terms and VP for the other. Glen and Sandra were always there when the club provided communication for events around Belleville. Radio Amateurs of Canada Insurance asks for club membership information as of the end of May. When the list was compiled we had 78 members. 15 were not RAC members. There is an additional charge for non RAC members, it has increased to \$13 each. We currently charge membership an extra \$10 for each non RAC. Our latest membership list has 76 members with 45 not being RAC members. For those who have not renewed please do so before spring and those who are not RAC members you should consider joining. RAC is our voice, in Canada and Internationally. It is a not-for-profit membership association with headquarters in Ottawa, representing the interests of Amateur Radio all across Canada. Speaking on behalf of Canadian Radio Amateurs, RAC provides liaison with government agencies and carries the Amateur voice about regulatory and spectrum issues to the discussion table with government and industry leaders, nationally and internationally. RAC is the Canadian voting member society of the International Amateur Radio Union. RAC also provides many services, publications and supplies to its members to enhance their enjoyment of Amateur Radio. RAC was instrumental in the changes to Distracted Driving Legislation and Emergency Services, allowing amateurs to use their radio while driving. They made this push in all Provinces and Territories. They also publish a bimonthly magazine distributed to members called *The Canadian Amateur*. Our club insurance covers club activities and club members during events and at home. Our club insurance for next year is \$572.52. If the calculations were done with the current membership numbers it would have cost us \$991.02, an increase of \$418.50. RAC has opened registration for the next on-line basic course which will start in February. Anyone interested should visit rac.ca.
